

68TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION NDHP BILLS OF INTEREST



The Legislature sent 590 bills to the governor's desk, out of a total of 932 bills introduced. Burgum signed 583 bills, vetoed seven bills in their entirety and partially vetoed Senate Bill 2015, the Office of Management and Budget appropriations bill.

HB1316: Addition of autocycles to title 39. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

HB1325: ROW violation increased to \$40. **STATUS**: Failed in Senate

HB1417: Entries against a driving record. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

HB1475: Raise interstate limit to 80 mph. **STATUS**: Vetoed by Governor

HB1493: Relating to operator's licenses. **STATUS**: Failed in Senate

HB1506: Removes bicycles & ridden animals from impaired driving. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2108: Parks/Recreation motor vehicle permit fees. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2111: Electronic certificate of title. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2118: Relating to abandoned motor vehicles on public land. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2168: Doubles fines for violations of 21 mph or higher. **STATUS**: Failed in Senate

SB2169: Fees for certain traffic offenses and assessed city fines. **STATUS**: Failed in Senate

SB2189: Removes 'knowingly' from road closure violations. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2193: Relating to motor vehicle dealer licenses. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2285: Increases penalty to B misdemeanor for leaving scene. **STATUS**: Failed in House

SB2348: Motor vehicle owner's liability for fleeing a peace officer. **STATUS**: Failed in House

SB2350: Relating to traffic signs. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2362: Seatbelt usage-primary enforcement. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

HCR3009: Designation of "ND Share the Road Safety Week" **STATUS**: Filed with Secy. of State

SB2147: Income tax deduction-retired law enforcement personnel benefits **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2171: Added health benefit option, employee pays appx \$50/month **STATUS**: Failed in House

SB2198: Relating to state employee medical leave. **STATUS**: Signed by Governor

SB2239: Govt unit - defined contribution using actuarial valuations **STATUS**: Failed in House
