### Implied Consent Administrative Hearing Training

Remedial in nature, Implied Consent laws are designed to remove impaired drivers from our roadways without the delays involved in the criminal court process. While largely successful, the administrative hearings process itself is not without its challenges. This course will highlight important aspects of the Implied Consent process, from the initial contact through the administrative hearing. The constitutional and statutory issues will be discussed, including attention to search and seizure, time of driving or actual physical control, field sobriety testing, the Report and Notice, and other matters arising at hearings. Taught by a retired Chief Hearing Officer for the North Dakota Department of Transportation with over 20 years of experience holding Implied Consent hearings, this class is designed to better prepare law enforcement officers for Implied Consent administrative hearings.
