

Standardized Field Sobriety Testing/Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement Hybrid Refresher

The DUI Detection & Standardized Field Sobriety Testing/Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (A.R.I.D.E) Hybrid Refresher (SFST/ARIDE Hybrid Refresher) curriculum is a NHTSA based and ND P.O.S.T. approved program. This curriculum is designed to be delivered as a refresher course and to help those officers become more proficient at detecting, apprehending, testing and prosecuting impaired drivers believed to be under the influence. This course is for officers who are experienced in DUI detection and who display proficiency with detection and apprehension. Officers attending must be SFST certified and **must have attended an ARIDE course in the past**. The course subject matter relates to two curriculums, the "Standardized Field Sobriety Testing" and "Drug Evaluation and Classification programs." This course will offer additional information to law enforcement officers on detecting impairment caused by more than just alcohol. Once an officer completes the training they will be more proficient with the three battery of tests (HGN,WAT,OLS), as well as a broader knowledge of drug impairment indicators. The law enforcement officer will also be more familiar with the DRE program and its function. This will facilitate better communication and transfer of critical roadside indicators of impairment to the evaluating DRE officer for a more complete and accurate assessment of the impairment.
