

## **Injury Crash Media Release**

**What:** Two vehicle injury crash  
**Where:** 4400 Block 45<sup>th</sup> Street S, Fargo  
**When:** March 18, 2022, approx.. 10:00 p.m. CT  
**Road Conditions:** Good – dry concrete, lighted w/ street lights  
**Weather Conditions:** Clear, ~37 degrees  
**Crash Involvement:** Car Vs. motorcycle  
**Type of Crash:** Rear-end  
**Agencies Involved:** Fargo Police, Fargo Fire, NDHP

**Vehicle No. 1:** 2011 Infinity G37  
**Driver No. 1:** 18 yoa Male; Moorhead, MN; not injured  
**Restraints:** Seat belt in use, air bags did not deploy  
**Charges:** Under investigation

**Passenger No. 1:** 19 yoa male; Fargo, ND; not injured  
**Restraints:** Seat belt in use  
**Passenger No. 2:** 19 yoa male; Fargo, ND; not injured  
**Restraints:** Seat belt in use  
**Passenger No. :** 18 yoa female; Moorhead, MN; not injured  
**Restraints:** Seat belt in use

**Vehicle No. 2:** 2022 Kawasaki ZX636  
**Driver No. 2:** 21 yoa male; Fargo, ND; non-life threatening injuries  
**Restraints:** Helmet worn  
**Charges:** Under investigation

**NARRATIVE:** On March 18 at approximately 10:00 p.m, the vehicles above were traveling southbound on 45<sup>th</sup> Street S in Fargo. At the 4400 Block, the 2011 Infinity rear-ended the 2022 Kawasaki. The motorcycle rider was dragged underneath the car until it came to rest. Other motorists that observed the crash and stopped to help, which involved lifting the car off the motorcycle rider. The car then started on fire. Both vehicles sustained disabling damage.

The Fargo Police Department and Fargo Fire Department responded to the crash and requested Highway Patrol assistance. The crash remains under investigation by the ND Highway Patrol. Although the circumstances surrounding the crash are still being investigated, safety devices (helmet usage) played an important role in this crash to keep the motorcycle from sustaining more significant injuries. Motorists are reminded to buckle up and wear safety gear on every trip.
