Injury Motorcycle Crash

What: Injury

Where: I-94 East mm 352, Fargo

When: September 16, 2024, at 8:36 PM

Vehicle No. 1: 2023 Zhejiang Cfmoto Motorcycle (sport bike)

Driver No. 1: Female, 39, Fargo, ND, serious non-life threatening

Restraints: No Helmet

Charges: DUI, drove vehicle other than permitted by license (no motorcycle endorsement)

Vehicle No. 2: 2007 Dodge Ram 2500 pulling a tandem axle camper trailer

Driver No. 2: Male, 75, Bakersfield, CA

Restraints: seatbelt

Charges: none

Passenger No. 1: Female, 64, Bakersfield, CA

Restraints: seatbelt

NARRATIVE: The east bound lanes of I-94, between University Dr. and the Red River Bridge, were backed up due to road construction in Minnesota on I-94. Traffic was at a standstill and slowly moving at times. A Zhejiang Cfmoto motorcycle in the left lane had just caught up to

the standstill traffic and had slowed down. The motorcycle was slowly moving forward when it tipped to the right, throwing the driver off. The driver landed in the middle lane just when traffic started to move again. The driver was then run over by a camper trailer being towed by a Dodge Ram 2500 and was dragged a short distance.

The 39-year-old female motorcycle driver sustained serious, non-life-threatening injuries and was transported to Sanford Health. The crash remains under investigation by the North Dakota Highway Patrol
