One-vehicle Rollover Crash on Interstate 29 in Pembina County

What: minor injury one-vehicle crash

Where: Interstate 29, 10 miles north of Drayton, ND

When: 4/29/2019 at approximately 3:35 PM

Road Conditions: Good

Weather Conditions: Cloudy

Crash Involvement: Single vehicle

Type of Crash: Rollover

Agencies Involved: North Dakota Highway Patrol, Pembina County Sheriff's Office, Drayton Fire & Ambulance

Vehicle No. 1: 2006 Chrysler Town & Country

Driver No. 1: Lance Loer; 51 years of age; of Humboldt, Minnesota; minor injuries

Restraints: Seat belt not in use

Charges: DUI, driving while license revoked

NARRATIVE: Loer was driving the Chrysler north on Interstate 29. He failed to negotiate a curve, and the Chrysler ran off the road. Loer overcorrected, and his vehicle overturned in the east ditch. Loer sustained minor injuries but was not transported for treatment.

The crash remains under investigation by the Highway Patrol.
