Stolen Vehicle Pursuit – Bismarck

Bismarck, ND – At approximately 12:00 pm, a Trooper with the North Dakota Highway Patrol responded to report of a reckless vehicle along Interstate 94 east of Bismarck, ND. The Trooper located the vehicle and attempted to stop it for a speeding violation. The vehicle fled eastbound on Interstate 94 at a high rate of speed. Near Exit 176 (McKenzie), the vehicle went through the median and proceeded to travel eastbound in the westbound lanes of Interstate 94. The vehicle then exited at Exit 176 and proceeded south through the town of McKenzie. The vehicle fled east of McKenzie into a field where it became stuck. The driver fled on foot before being taken into custody. The driver was identified as Jeffrey Sandoval (39). The vehicle was identified as having been reported stolen out of Bismarck, ND. Sandoval was taken to the Burleigh-Morton Detention Center for multiple charges related to this incident.
