NDHP OVERVIEW 2019

THE MISSION OF THE NORTH DAKOTA HIGHWAY PATROL IS TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE EVERY DAY BY PROVIDING HIGH QUALITY LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES TO KEEP NORTH DAKOTA SAFE AND SECURE.

The North Dakota Highway Patrol (NDHP) is comprised of two components: field operations and administration. Field operations includes four geographic regions and motor carrier operations. Administration includes finance, safety and education, support services, human resources, and the Law Enforcement Training Academy (LETA).

The LETA provides basic and advanced training to law enforcement and correctional officers. 828 employees from local, state, tribal, and federal agencies attended training in 2019, and 113 of those graduated from basic training to become licensed peace officers.

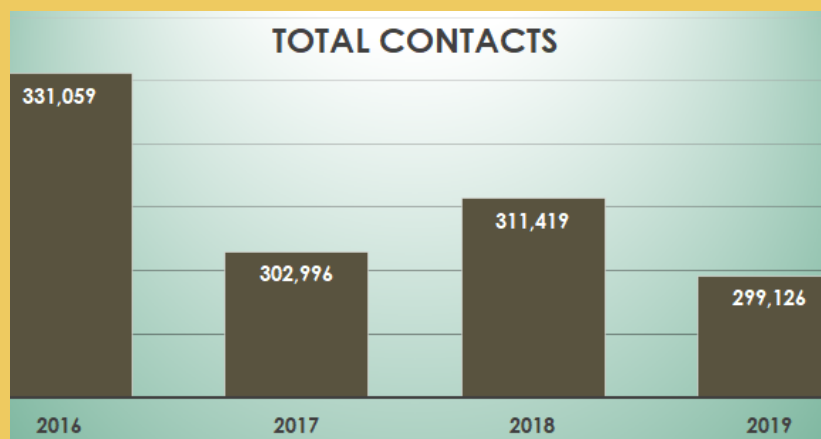
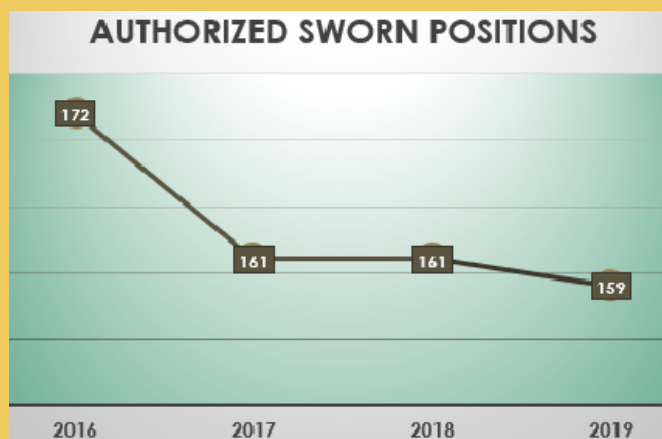
A variety of specialized assignments and programs contribute to the highway patrol's success including canine officers, crash technicians and reconstructionists, emergency response team members, drug recognition experts, an aircraft section, and a motor carrier safety assistance program.

State troopers work diligently to eliminate injuries and fatalities that result from traffic crashes. Core areas of enforcement include impaired and distracted driving, right-of-way and speed violations, and occupant protection. Troopers enforce all criminal laws, protect highway infrastructure, and conduct commercial motor vehicle safety inspections.

NDHP employees focus on prevention and education efforts to improve driving behavior. In 2019, the NDHP provided 415 safety presentations to a variety of educational institutions and civic groups.

The NDHP is committed to fulfilling our public safety mission and providing professional law enforcement services to North Dakota citizens and the motoring public. Employees value and respect the trust and authority placed in our crucial roles.

- Hold individuals rather than groups accountable for their actions
