NDHP OVERVIEW 2020

The North Dakota Highway Patrol (NDHP) is comprised of two components: field operations and administration. Field operations includes four geographic regions and motor carrier operations. Administration includes finance, safety and education, support services, human resources, and the North Dakota Law Enforcement Training Academy (LETA).

The LETA provides basic and advanced training to law enforcement and correctional officers. 485 employees from local, state, tribal, and federal agencies attended training in 2020, and 126 of those graduated

from basic training to become newly licensed peace officers in North Dakota.

A variety of specialized assignments and programs contribute to the highway patrol's success including canine officers, crash technicians and reconstructionists, emergency response team members, drug recognition experts, an aircraft section, and a motor carrier safety assistance program.

State troopers work diligently to eliminate injuries and fatalities that result from traffic crashes, and the NDHP is a primary sponsor of the Vision Zero initiative. Core areas of enforcement include impaired and distracted driving, right-of-way and speed violations, and occupant protection. Troopers enforce all criminal laws, protect highway infrastructure, and conduct commercial motor vehicle safety inspections.

NDHP employees focus on prevention and education efforts to improve driving behavior. In 2020, the NDHP provided 156 safety presentations to a variety of educational institutions and civic groups which was lower than past years due to COVID-19.

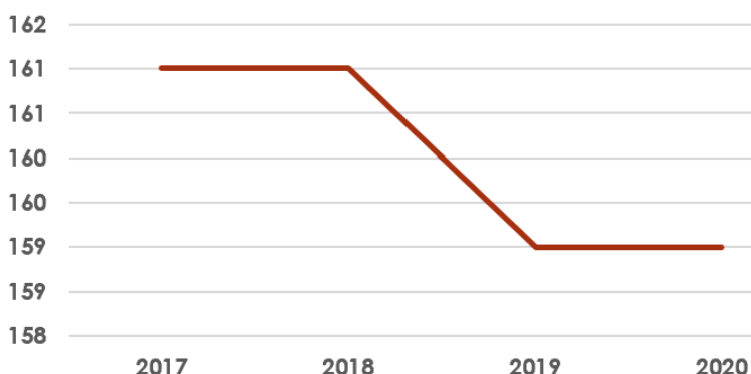

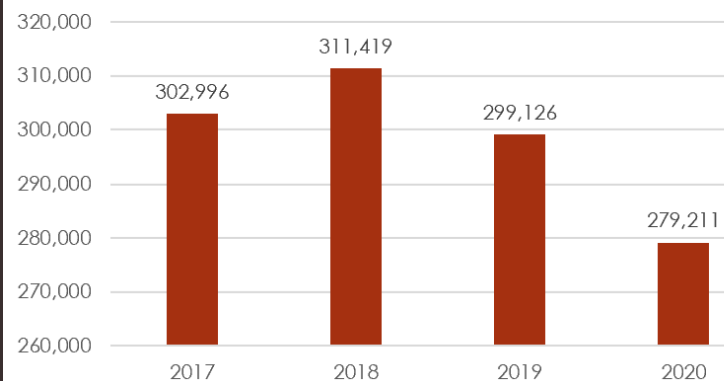

NDHP Authorized Sworn Positions

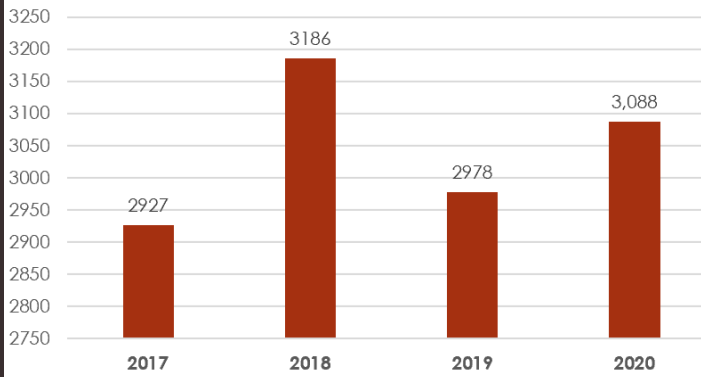

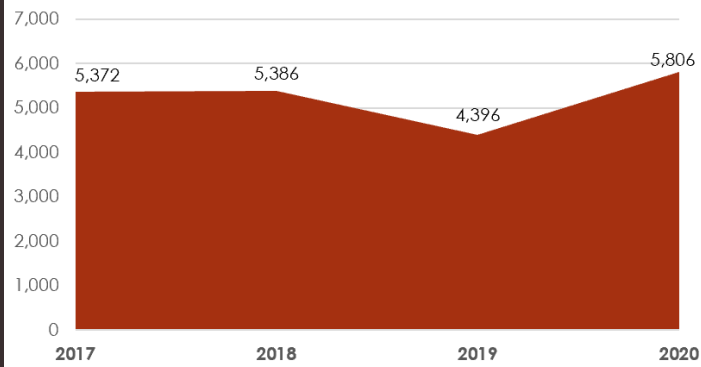

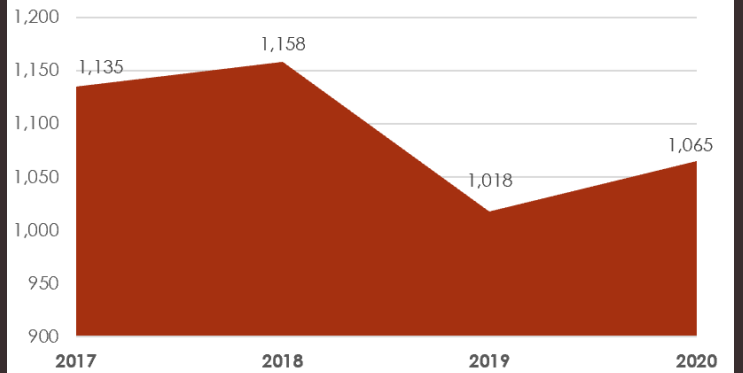

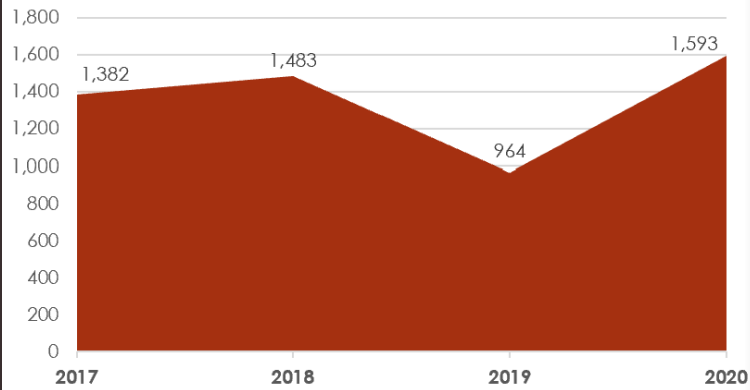
Criminal Arrests



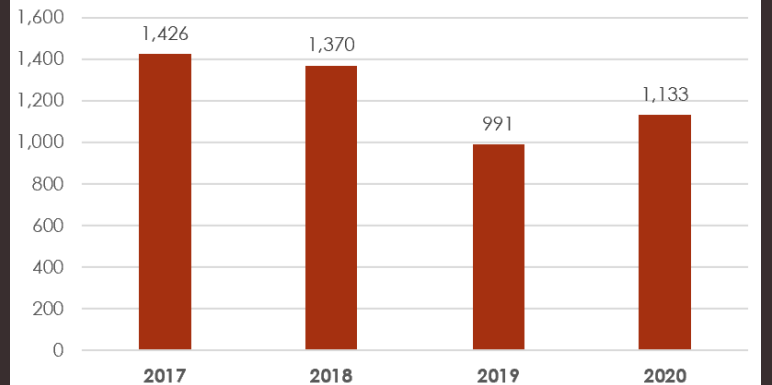
DUI Arrests



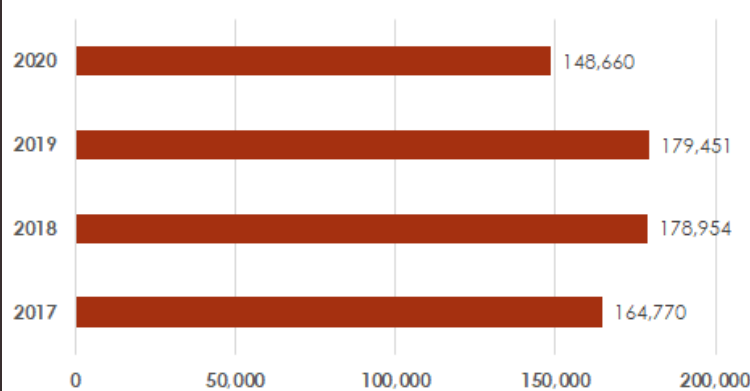
Drug Arrests



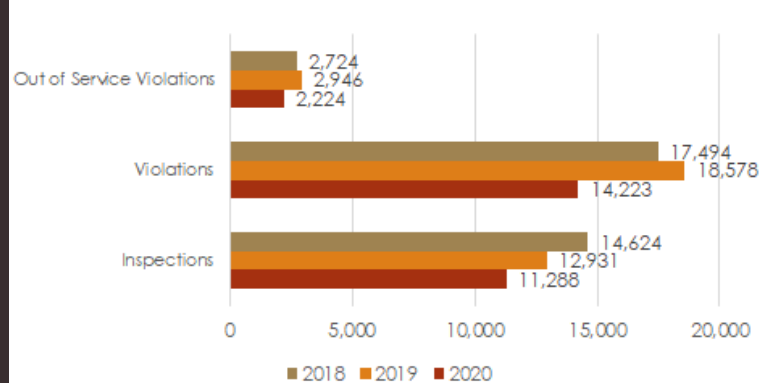
Overload Enforcement Contacts

CMV Driver/Vehicle Inspections and Violations (w/level 7 numbers) and Out-of-Service Violations

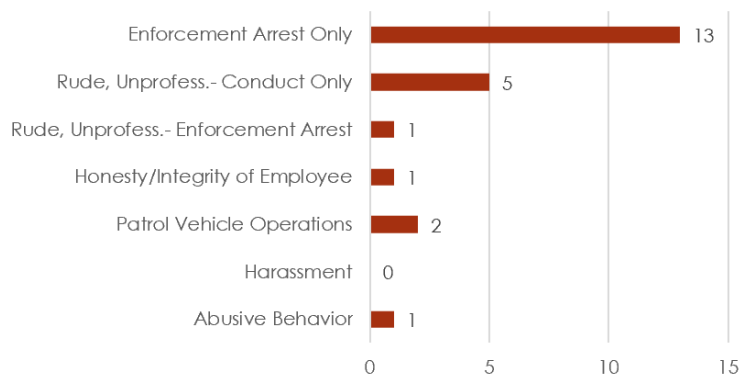

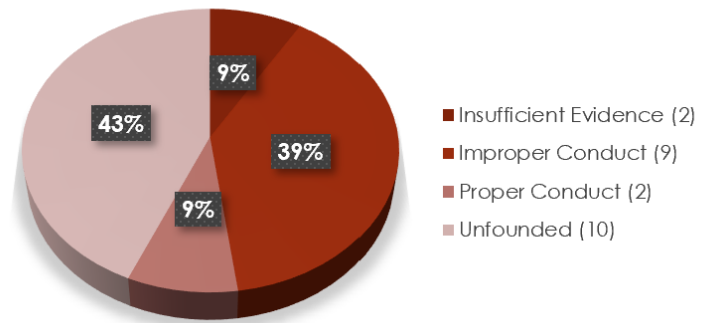

- Hold individuals rather than groups accountable for their actions
