

Premium Discount Application Update



As Risk Management started the process of delineating the discount inquiries for both discount programs for FY 08/09, we asked all risk management and workers compensation program contacts to provide us with their thoughts and suggestions on how the discount programs can be enhanced to reflect additional loss control practices that reduce the State's exposure to liability and workers injuries. Based on the suggestions Risk Management received, the discount applications have been revised. Both discount programs will continue to focus on the adoption of practices that justify the discounts by reducing the frequency and severity of claims brought against the State or involving injured state workers. Please click below to review **drafts** of the new discount applications. The percent of discount awarded will be determined by an independent annual actuarial analysis. Further suggestions will be taken for the next 30 days. At the end of the 30 day period applications forms will be finalized.
