Individuals who want to develop or strengthen their advocacy and leadership skills are encouraged to apply. Partners are chosen through a statewide competitive application process. If accepted, attendance is required at all three in-person trainings located in Bismarck. There are no costs incurred by the applicant to participate in the program.

Eligibility

Residents of ND with developmental disabilities (DD), as defined by the Developmental Disabilities Act, and/or parents of young children with DD are eligible to apply for PIP.

- Learn how to impact local, state, and national policies through advocacy and awareness
- Speak up, educate, and communicate on inclusion, education, housing, and employment.
- Improve the lives of people with DD in your local community and in ND.
